



Cookie Policy

Cookies are small files containing data, which are stored on your computer when you browse some websites. At Lacrosse Scotland, we use cookies to help us to understand how we can improve our website and make it easier to use. They also allow us to provide extra features, such as remembering your login details.

How we use cookies

The Lacrosse Scotland website may place a “cookie” in your browser file. The cookie allows us to provide certain information to you and to store information while you are using the Lacrosse Scotland website.

When you visit the Lacrosse Scotland website it sends you a cookie. Cookies may be used in the following ways:

- To help us recognise you as a unique visitor (this is a number) when you return to the Lacrosse Scotland website and to allow us to tailor content or advertisements to match your preferred interests or to avoid showing you the same adverts repeatedly.
- To compile anonymous, aggregated statistics that allow us to understand how users use the Lacrosse Scotland website and to help us improve the structure of the Lacrosse Scotland website. We cannot identify you personally in this way.

Two types of cookies may be used on the Lacrosse Scotland website:

- session cookies, which are temporary cookies that remain in the cookie file of your browser until you leave the Lacrosse Scotland website
- persistent cookies, which remain in the cookie file of your browser for much longer (though how long will depend on the lifetime of the specific cookie).

If Lacrosse Scotland uses a third party to serve advertisements on the Lacrosse Scotland website cookies may be associated with these advertisements to enable the advertiser to track the number of anonymous users responding to the campaign. Lacrosse Scotland does not have access to, or control of cookies placed by third parties.

How to disable cookies

You can prevent the use of cookies by configuring your web browser, but please note that this may hinder some of the Lacrosse Scotland website’s functionality. You can easily delete any cookies that have been installed in the cookie folder of your browser. For example, if you are using Microsoft Windows Explorer:

- Open ‘Windows Explorer’
- Click on the ‘Search’ button on the tool bar
- Type “cookie” into the search box for ‘Folders and files’
- Select ‘My Computer’ in the ‘Look in’ box



- Click 'Search now'
- Double click on the folders that are found
- 'Select' any cookie file
- Hit the 'delete' button on your keyboard

If You are not using Microsoft Windows Explorer, then you should select "cookies" in the "Help" function for information on where to find your cookie folder.
